RESEARCH COMMITTEE

The Research Committee met as needed in Fall and Spring semesters.

To increase research involvement, opportunity and productivity, the Committee again facilitated the second Research Symposium. The submissions were excellent, both in terms of numbers and quality. Many faculty served as reviewers and took much time and care in their reviews. A total of 24 posters were presented, and the two top papers (best student, best faculty-student) winners presented their research orally. In addition, a best poster winner was selected. We have sent out evaluation questionnaires, in an attempt to improve the Symposium for next year.
